7. Matters Arising	The Committee were updated further to the request made to CE			
	Highways for permission to landscape/plant trees in the green amenity area at the end of Westway, where rutting from vehicle tyres is damaging the grass. A planting plan would need to be formally submitted to CE Highways, which they would investigate, with a possible fee. Investigations to establish if services run under the area are currently underway, which would prevent a planting scheme taking place. A meeting with John Tickle to be arranged to consider any scheme further. • Cllr Blomeley updated the committee with data from the air quality monitoring points on the M6. The data presented, which was within limits, was from 2015/16 (see appendix 1). 2017 data is not yet available.

9. Highways Issues	1. Clir Blomeley gave a verbal report regarding the Strategic Transport Group Consultation event that he attended at Crewe Alexandra Stadium on the 19 th February, 2018. The event focussed on cross boundary issues both in the present and future and the following key ideas were raised: • It was proposed that a higher proportion of transport funding should be directed to the Local Authorities. • The idea of the possibility of a future transport authority for the north of England was put forward. • Proposals include more co-ordination regarding public transport in relation to such things as timetables, particularly in corridors of movement. 2. The committee noted the current petition initiated by Holmes Chapel Partnership in regard to pedestrian crossing provision at the proposed Chester Road / London Road roundabout. It runs until 31 March 2018 and currently has 300 signatures. All councillors can sign the petition in capacity as a resident. 3. The committee received a progress report on the progress of actions raised at the meeting with R. Welch of Cheshire East Highways on the 14 th November 2017. It was commented on that the Parish Council need to communicate Highways work undertaken to the parishioners, for awareness. It was agreed that a report be produced for future reference. 4. The committee was updated with the status of the new pedestrian crossing on Middlewich Road, which is due to be completed on the 2 nd March 2018.		
	I. To receive the verbal report II. To write to CE Highways, informing them that the petition is running and that the parish Council are supportive of the ethos for pedestrian safety. It will also be requested that the parish council have early involvement in the design process. III. To produce a summary report of highways issues.		
10. SIDs and Speedwatch	 10.1 A mobile SID on loan from the Cheshire Constabulary has been installed on Chester Road for data collection. The PCSO has been asked to arrange for the unit to be used on either Manor Lane or London Road. 10.2 A response from Brereton Parish Council is awaited before progressing the proposed speed limit reduction on London Road. 10.3 There was no further news on Speedwatch activities. RESOLVED (VI17/18/60) to receive the report. 		
11. Police Matters	The Committee noted the beat report for January 2018. The Clerk has contacted the constabulary requesting more detail in the reports but it was felt that the Parish Council should request more information on specific items when required rather than take more of the PCSOs time in routine report writing.		
	RESOLVED (VI17/18/61) to receive the report, and to invite PCSO Chesters to the Annual Parish meeting.		

12. Street signs	The committee noted the report on street signs, along with the quotation for replacement of those recommended for such. Comments relating to the cost of the new signs were made and it was proposed a more detailed breakdown be produced, separating the cost of the signs and the installation/repair work. RESOLVED (VI17/18/62) to produce a specification and to arrange for further quotes to be sought, to be brought back to the next Village and Infrastructure meeting.		
13. CCTV	There was no further news to report. Members plan to visit the control centre mid March 2018.		
14. Photography Competition	The HC partnership are happy to take over the running of the photography competition, with the prize to be presented at the "Celebrating Holmes Chapel" event in September 2018

15. Grass Verges	It was noted that several of the grass verges across the village are being systematically and severely damaged by vehicles, for differing reasons. RESOLVED (VI17/18/64) I. To raise the issue with CE Highways, via a meeting with John Tickle. II. For the office to compile a report of damaged verges to be brought back to the next VI meeting.
